## Novella Carpenter Speaks at Leadership Lecture Series

Carpenter appeared at the free event in conversation with KQED “Forum” host Michael Krasny to discuss her Marin County libraries’ 2014 “One Book One Marin” selection *Farm City: The Education of an Urban Farmer*. It reflects on her experiences creating a garden in a run-down neighborhood a mile from downtown Oakland.

Carpenter, a resident of Oakland, grew up in rural Idaho and Washington State. She attended the University of Washington in Seattle where she majored in Biology and English. She studied under Michael Pollan for two years while attending Berkeley's Graduate School of Journalism. Her writing has appeared on Salon.com, Saveur.com and the food and wine section in the *San Francisco Chronicle*. Her new memoir, *Gone Feral: Tracking My Dad Through the Wild*, will be published in June.
