Ensler, a Tony Award-winning playwright, performer, activist and founder of V-Day, the global movement to end violence against women and girls, was in the midst of a 19-city U.S. book tour for her new book *In the Body of the World*, a visionary memoir of separation and connection to the body, the self, and the world.

The *Vagina Monologues* has been translated into more than 48 languages and performed in more than 140 countries, including sold-out runs at Off-Broadway's Westside Theater, on London's West End (2002 Olivier Award nomination, Best Entertainment), and 11-year runs in Mexico City and Paris.
